



## 4. First-aid measures

<b>Inhalation</b>	Move to fresh air. If symptoms persist, get medical attention. Under normal conditions of intended use, this material is not expected to be an inhalation hazard.
<b>Skin contact</b>	Rinse with water. If skin irritation or rash occurs: Get medical advice/attention. Wash contaminated clothing before reuse.
